Objections of the A.O. to leading members of our agencies.

Against Max Hamers of our agency in Brazil on account of leaving him the majority proportionate to his share in the sales organisation and on account of collision of interests by his own enterprise.
(In the meantime, the I.O. is influentially sharing Hamers'-enterprises)

Against Alfred Moll of our agency in Argentina on account of a not unconditionally positive attitude towards the spirit of the new Germany.

Against Theodor Sohn of our agency in Columbia on account of his not being to be trusted from the German point of view (German and Chilean citizenship)

Objections of the A.O. and of the Reich's Ministry of Economy to the changes in our agencies.

Agency in Argentina

Change of firm was impossible in consequence of the unsurmountable resistance of the A.O., especially on account of the giving up of the name of the firm: Anilinas Alemanas.

Agency in Columbia

The A.O. and the Reich's Ministry of Economy subsequently protested against the effected change of the firm, against Mr. Sohn as the manager of our agency at Medellin, and against Eudesindo Echavarría, one of our important clients, as a partner. The question was orally settled.

Impositions of the A.O. and of the Exchange Control Office on occasion of the purchase of the "Monopol" of Buenos Aires

These impositions are now impracticable to the greatest part.
Personal composition of the management.
