A document, OCC file No. R102, was shown to the witness. This document is a summary covering the time from 1 October to 51 October 1941, of the activities of the Einsatz groups in Russia. The witness states that this document seems to be in the form and manner as the reports he read at intervals during parts of 1941 and 1942. However, witness cannot remember if he had read this one before, but reasserts that the document is similar to the ones he had seen. Some of the reports he read were shouter and contained only the locations of the groups and Kommandos. ..itness says that these reports were distributed within RSHA as well as outside the organization, for example, to Ministries. As proof that these documents were relatively widely distributed, the witness points out that the document is marked to indicate 100 copics were made and there were not 100 sections within RSHA who were interested in this document. While an interned in Moosburg, witness saw Kriminal. rat Funy, former Chief of the AMT for Communists Affairs in RSHA during the later part of the war, who he believes should know more details about the reports from the Einsatz groups and their distribution.

Witness re-edited an affidavit prepared on basis of former interrogations, referring to Document E180, Stahlecker's report covering his
actions in the Baltic countries during the autumn of 1941. Witness included above mentioned Document R102 into the affidavit. The affidavit
will be re-drafted for signature of the witness.
