Interrogation of . . . . . Walter WARLIMONT

WARLIMONT identified his initial on document 884-PS, which concerned the treatment to be accorded to captured Russian political representatives. WARLIMONT denied, however, that he knew anything of the meeting on 16 July 1941 between representatives of the OKW and of the police (Document 502-PS), the meeting at which SCHELLENBURG and HEYDRICH represented the police and as a result of which directions to police commandos were drawn up. He stated that perhaps General REINECKE either attended the meeting or would be able to identify the representatives of the OKW who attended. WARLIMONT thought that either KEITEL or JODL knew about the matter as Document 884-PS was sent to JODL, according to the distribution list thereon.

WARLIMONT identified Document 822-PS, the intelligence and espionage set-up for the Russian operation, by recognizing the signature of CANARIS thereon and his own initial as well as those of KEITEL and JODL.
