GENERAL MEMORANDUM NO. 8:

- Subjects: 1. Necessity of Security Precautions.
2. Restriction of Leave Privileges.
3. Amendment to General Memorandum No. 5.
4. Assignment of Personnel.

1. All personnel of this Office are directed to take immediate and effective steps to insure that no trial brief, document, interrogation, or evidentiary or planning material of any kind is permitted to fall into the hands of any representative of the press, the accused or their counsel or any other unauthorized person in advance of formal presentation at the trial. Discussion of the case in the presence of unauthorized persons must be limited to such general subjects as are already public knowledge. The employment of German civilians within the Palace of Justice and the presence there of counsel for the defendants and of representatives of the press require special care in guarding papers in offices and restricting discussion of the case.

2. No leave will be granted to military or civilian personnel of this Office until further notice except in emergency cases. Division and section chiefs will not forward applications for leave unless they are prepared to certify that the application meets the requirement herein stated.

3. The last paragraph of paragraph 5, General Memorandum No. 5, this Office, 22 October 1945, now reading as follows:

"No further search for new documents shall be made except with its approval. No further witnesses shall be brought to Nurnberg for interrogation, and no person whatever shall be brought or invited to Nurnberg for any purpose if it is expected that messing or billeting will be provided by the United States without approval of the Review Board and the further approval of the Executive Officer. No field trips shall be undertaken without authorization by the Board and the Executive Officer."


is hereby amended by striking out the entire paragraph and by inserting in lieu thereof a new paragraph as follows:

"No further search for any documents shall be made except with its approval. No further witnesses shall be brought to Nurnberg for interrogation without its approval and the further approval of the Executive Officer. No person whatsoever shall be brought or invited to Nurnberg for any purpose if it is expected that messing or billeting will be provided by the United States without approval of the Executive Officer. No field trips shall be undertaken without authorization by the Board and the Executive Officer."
